

Energisa advances another dividend for 2016

On February 17, 2017 the Energisa S/A Board of Directors approved the advancement of another dividend from the earnings for FY 2016 amounting to R\$ 98.9 million (R\$ 0.286 per Unit or R\$ 0.0572 per common and preferred share). Payment starts on 3/8/2017.

Company shareholders with holdings on or before 2/22/2017 are entitled to the dividends, including shares bought on the stock exchange on or before this date. The Company's shares will accordingly be traded ex-dividend from 2/23/2017.

Technical Officers to swap positions within Energisa Group

On March 01, 2017, three Technical Officers will swap positions and take their expertise and know-how to other concessions.

Electrical engineer Amaury Damiance will take over the Technical Board of Energisa Mato Grosso (EMT). Aged 57, Amaury has been working at Energisa for 27 years, leading the Technical Board of Energisa Sergipe for the last six years.

Juliano Ferraz de Paula, who has been working at Energisa for eleven years, is moving to the Technical Board of Energisa Sergipe. Aged 42, Juliano is an

electrical engineer and a lawyer, with a postgraduate degree in occupational safety and an MBA in Business Management, People Management and Managerial Development. He has been serving on the technical board of Energisa Tocantins (ETO) for the last three years.

Alessandro Brum is taking over the Technical Board of ETO, and brings with him the entire expertise accumulated during eleven years at Energisa, in addition to experience in dealing with challenges at EMT, where he has served as an officer for the last three years.

Energisa Group's consumption captive and free energy consumption rises 4.1% in January 2017

In tandem with the economic recovery, Energisa Group's captive and free electricity consumption (2,477.2 GWh) rose slightly in January by 4.1% over the same month last year. If uninvoiced sales are counted, the volume rises to 2,463.2 GWh, an increase of 7.8% over the same month the previous year.

Partly because of consumers migrating from the captive sector, the free market (TUSD) experienced consumption

growth of 42.6%. Captive consumption (2,061.1 GWh) contracted slightly by 0.7% in the month, due to the aforesaid migrations.

All the Group's distribution companies experienced consumption growth (captive, free and uninvoiced), with notable increases in the concessions held by: EBO (+30.4%); EPB (+12.6%); ETO (+9.1%); EMS (8.8%) and CNEE (+8.0%).
